## **Director's Notes**

Greetings!

Taking the big leap from actor to director has been on my radar for a few years now. When I started seriously considering directing a show, the only imperative I was faced with was to find a solid comedy. So, I spent much of the past two years looking for a script to direct. I wanted a show that spoke to me, my

sensibilities, and my passions. One of the first scripts I picked up when I started seriously searching was the show you're about to see.

As I tore through the script, reliving the Gorski family's extra special 1990 Christmas Eve, I was taken with the love shown by this family. I don't like calling the Gorskis a "dysfunctional" family because, lets face it, at most family gatherings, heated disagreements about politics, race, sexuality or religion are bound to crop up. Greetings! could easily have just been a play about a staunch, staid-in-his-ways disgruntled Catholic patriarch locking horns with his elder son's Jewish-turned-atheist girlfriend as matters of faith (or her serious lack thereof) overtake what promised to be a peaceful Christmas Eve. I also resist calling them "dysfunctional" because they aren't – the Gorskis, for all of their faults and quirks, are a highly functioning family, filled with love for one another.

And let's be frank, to borrow a famous lyric, "What the world needs now is love, sweet love. It's the only thing that there's just too little of. What the world needs now is love, sweet love. No, not just for some, but for *everyone*."

### **CAST and CREW**

**Peter Bacon (Mickey Gorski)** is a third year Theater and Economics student at the University of Maine. He has performed in several Umaine shows including this semester's production of *A nonymous*. ### Angela Bonacasa (Producer/Movement

Consultant) is a director, fight director, and stage combat instructor based in Castine. She is a Certified Teacher of Stage Combat with the Society of American Fight Directors, and has worked for over 20 years as a fight director and stage combat instructor. Her fight direction has been seen on stages in Chicago, New York, Maine, and theaters across the country. She has choreographed shows locally for the Belfast Maskers, Penobscot Theatre Company, Ten Bucks Theatre Company, Camden Shakespeare Festival and Midcoast Theater Company, among others. She teaches Acting and Movement at the University of Maine, and is Artistic Director of the Orono based company True North

Theatre, where she has directed *Becky's New Car*, *The Lion in Winter*, *The House of Yes*, *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof*, and *The Odd Couple*.



Tellis K. Coolong (Director) is extremely proud to be directing this, the second co-production between Ten Bucks Theatre and True North Theatre, a company he helped co-found in 2017. A huge thanks to the dedicated cast, design team, and production crew for their tireless work in bringing *Greetings!* to life. Telly has previously appeared on-stage for True North Theatre in productions of *The Odd Couple* (as Oscar), *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof* (as Big Daddy), *Table Manners* (as Reg), *Becky's New Car* (as Steve), and was a featured player in True North and Ten Bucks previous collaboration, *Spoon River Anthology*. Telly would like to dedicate this production to the Coolong and the Harris families and their tales of the glories of Christmases long, long ago.

She is a founding member/actor/director for Ten Bucks Theatre Co. and has directed TBT's productions of *The Bald Soprano*, Terra Nova, The Effects of Gamma Rays on Man-in-the-Moon Marigolds, Macbeth, Twelfth Night, Romeo and Juliet, Hamlet, One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, A Midsummer Night's Dream (co-directed), The Tempest, Death of a Salesman, The Comedy of Errors, The Merry Wives of Windsor, The Elephant Man, Spoon River Anthology, and most recently co-directed As You Like It. For UMaine she has directed The Legend of Sleepy Hollow, The Curious Savage, Rumors, The Mineola Twins and Twelfth Night. Directing credits also include The Odd Couple and Arsenic and Old Lace for The Grand in Ellsworth. Favorite roles include Lady Macbeth in Macbeth, Sister Mary in Sister Mary Ignatius Explains It All for You, Martha in Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?, Nat in Rabbit Hole, Lady Bracknell in The Importance of Being Earnest, Sybil in Fawlty Towers, Louise in Always...Patsy Cline, Mark Antony in Julius Caesar, Van Helsing in Dracula, Mrs. Webb in Our Town, Mattie Fae in August Osage County, Annie in Calendar Girls and Eleanor of Aquitaine in The Lion in Winter. She was most recently seen in Penobscot Theatre's productions of Safety Net and Flyin' Solo. Next up she will direct the play, Terra Nova for UMaine Spring 2022. Julie lives in Bangor with her husband Ron and their daughter, Natalie Acadia.
